Christmas - The Life-Changing Chapter!

Dear Friends

It feels very strange to begin a Christmas 2023 message with a 'Goodbye', but as this will be my last Christmas with you here in the Dales, it feels only right to take this opportunity to thank you for your wonderful welcome since my arrival in September 2019 and bid you a fond farewell as I look towards my retirement in July 2024 and a move to Scotland. When I received the phone call inviting me to write this year's Christmas message, it seemed only fitting to say 'yes' recognising that I was also invited upon my arrival in 2019. At that stage I was at the beginning of a new chapter in my ministry as I settled into life in the beautiful North Yorkshire Dales, adjusting to new accents and a new culture, and colder weather! Soon I will begin yet another new chapter, this time as a retired Minister living in Scotland, again adjusting to new accents, a new culture, and even colder weather! My life, so far, has been a large book full of differing chapters taking me far and wide where I have met many wonderful people with whom I have been privileged to journey alongside, and always, whether I have been conscious of it or not, in the presence of God. As we once again approach Christmas with all the familiarity that it often brings, maybe it is good to stop and reflect upon the reality of what it really represents. For it was, and continues to be, a life-changing new chapter in the lives of so many.

Mary and Joseph were about to begin a new chapter in their lives. Betrothed, many years before, through a family arrangement, they had now met, decided that 'yes', they did like each other, and 'yes', they would like to be married, and therefore their traditional year of betrothal or engagement, before their marriage was due to take place, had begun. Mary was young, Joseph older as per tradition, with an established trade and a means to provide for his young wife, but both inevitably looking forward to this new chapter in their lives and we can imagine some of the excitement and trepidation as they got to know each other and planned for their future. An ordinary everyday story about two people falling in love and planning for their future that brings a smile to our lips. However, two people who lived more than 2000 years ago that you and I would never have heard of if God had not

turned their lives upside down in a mighty, terrifying, and unbelievable way.

Mary, a young, innocent, barely physically mature, girl, is chosen to be the mother of God's Son, and Joseph, not yet her husband, is trusted by God to be this precious child's father. Even as I type these words on the page the impact of this scenario hits me hard. If we read the scriptures, we know that Mary is hurriedly sent away to stay with her elderly aunt and uncle whilst the dust settles so to speak, and poor Joseph is initially in a right quandary not knowing what to do and thinking it might be best to quietly divorce Mary (i.e. end the official betrothal arrangement). The Bible makes it sound as if they both immediately took this catastrophic news in their stride and just got on with things, but we know enough about what it means to be human that it was never that simple. It took a while for this precious but ordinary couple to embrace this new unanticipated and perĥaps unwanted chapter of their lives. However, embrace it they did, partly because of their character, and their blossoming love as a couple, inevitably with much support from their families, but ultimately because they trusted God for what lay ahead of them. God was present and gave them strength, but my goodness, my heart goes out to this incredible couple as they began to make sense of a chapter in their lives that they never saw coming, and all the subsequent chapters. Jesus their incredible son, responsible for his upbringing, his nurture, teaching him right from wrong, negotiating sibling squabbles and rivalry, Joseph passing on his trade, Mary leaning on her oldest son after the death of Joseph. So many more chapters to come and then just as Mary was beginning to think it was time for Jesus to settle down and marry, he embarks on a new chapter in his life, a 3-year ministry where incredible miraculous things happen way beyond his mother's understanding, but which soon takes an ugly turn and culminates in his brutal death and breaks her heart.

Still reeling from the death of her beloved son and feeling so alone with the pain of loss crushing all hope and joy, Mary is a broken woman, very different from the young girl who first received the news that she was to bear God's only Son, when something happens that isn't just a life-changing chapter, and there have been many of those, but turns all things upside down, Jesus rises from the dead, and the penny

finally drops, her incredible son truly is the Son of God. God is with us!

I wonder what twists and turns your life has taken, how many new chapters, perhaps some of them unanticipated and unwanted? The Christmas story taken in its simplest form is the story of God with us. It is, of course, in many ways far more complicated and still difficult for many to accept or embrace, but it is also a story of hope, perseverance, determination, solutions and most importantly, love.

So may the Love of God fill your life this Christmas and may you know God's presence in this chapter and all the chapters of your life that are to come.

This is practical support for day-to-day domestic tasks that will support you and help you to remain independent at home. It could also be support for you after a hospital stay while you get back on your feet. This might include cleaning, making/changing beds, doing the washing up, doing the laundry, hoovering, gardening, changing light bulbs etc. The council can arrange homecare for you if you are eligible, please contact the council directly or speak with your GP, or support can be arranged privately. The Wensleydale School News

The Key Stage 3 curriculum here at The Wensleydale School includes Oracy, something that develops through years 7, 8 and 9 the students' ability to articulate ideas, develop understanding and engage with others through the spoken language.

During enrichment time at the end of each day some students in year 9 have chosen to take their Oracy skills and join the Debate Club. As a club we are working to develop a league with local schools for regular debate matches and have also entered the national debate competition run by the English Speaking Union.

We registered for the competition at the beginning of the year and were entered for the first round in a group of four schools, including Queen Mary's School, St Aidan and St John Fisher Associated 6th Form, Ripon Grammar School and The Wensleydale School.

In each round the judges give their verdict; it is not necessarily the winner of each debate that progresses to the next round; teams are scored according to the criteria above and the teams with the highest scores on the evening progress.

To finish the evening the judges provided general feedback for all the teams and then identified, in no particular order: The Wensleydale School, St Aidan and St John Fisher Associated 6th Form and Ripon Grammar as qualifying for the next round of the competition.

The team and the club are very, very excited about their success and we wait to hear from the English Speaking Union on December 7th when Round 2 matches and motions are revealed.

News From Hawes School

We had a visit form Laura from North Yorkshire Fire Service this month. All the children listened to the messages including Nursery. In school we have had follow up conversations around the messages. Heavens Above

We've one of the best meteor showers of the year this month – the Geminids – famous for producing loads of bright slow-moving 'shooting stars'. It reaches its peak on the night of **December 13th/14th** when you could spot over a 100 meteors an hour if it's a good year. Best time to look is late evening from 10.00pm onwards. With no moon to spoil the view it should be a great show – weather permitting of course. If you miss this display you might like to try and catch the Quadrantids shower on the night of **January 3rd/4th**. It's not quite as good as the Geminids, producing around 40 meteors an hour, but still well worth taking a look at.

Most of us can't wait for the long dark nights to come to an end but if you fancy a bit of stargazing, the next couple of months are probably the best time of the year. By the middle of the evening early on in December most of the bright winter star patterns are well on view in the south with the constellation of Orion, the Mighty Hunter of the old Greek myths, dominating the scene. His upright rectangular outline is easy to pick out with a red-giant star, Betelgeuse, marking his right shoulder, blue-white Rigel his left knee and a sloping line of three brightish stars forming his 'Belt'. Just below the Belt's middle star you'll find his 'Sword', a huge star-forming cloud of gas and dust which shows up well in binoculars.

The three Belt stars are a useful guide for finding a number of other impressive winter-sky objects. Following them downwards towards the south-eastern horizon takes you to the Hunter's faithful Hound, Sirius the Dog Star, easily the brightest star in the sky. It's beaten for brightness this year, however, by the Solar System's largest planet, Jupiter, shining brilliantly much higher in the south-west. Following the Belt stars upwards brings you to the constellation named after Orion's old adversary, Taurus the Bull. Aldebaran, another reddish coloured star, lying in front of the Hyades open star cluster, marks the fierce bovine's baleful eye. Higher and to the west lies the beautiful Pleiades star cluster another fine binocular target which bring hundreds more stars into view than the 7 or 8 normally visible to the naked eye. Above Orion's Head lies Capella the She Goat, the bright yellow leader of Auriga the Charioteer. Back towards the east, high over Orion's right shoulder, you'll find the twin stars, Castor and Pollux, and below them

Procyon, the smaller of Orion's hounds. On a clear night from a really dark location, you should be able to glimpse the Winter Milky Way running right across the sky from the distinctive 'W' of Cassiopeia high in the northwest down past Procyon towards Sirius low in the south-east.

If you're rolling home in the early morning hours during the festive season keep a look-out for the planet Venus, a dazzling 'Christmas Star' blazing away low in the east just before dawn.

A Merry Christmas and a happy New Year. Here's hoping for lots of clear skies in 2024.

Open the fowls all down the back and bone them; first the pigeon, then the partridge; cover them; then the fowl, then the goose, and then the turkey, which must be large; season them all well first, and lay them in the crust, so that it will look only like a whole turkey; then have a hare ready cased and wiped with a clean cloth; cut it into pieces, that is, joint it; season it and lay it as close as you can get on one side; on the other side woodcocks, moor game, and what sort of wild fowl you can get; season them well and lay them close; put at least four pounds of butter into the pie, then lay on your lid, which must be a very thick one, and let it be well baked; it must have a very hot oven and will take at least four hours.

November 2023

The Market House team of Laura Dunn, Administrator, and Alison Wade, Caretaker, continue to work hard to keep the Market House not only running as it should on a day-to-day basis, but also by continually driving forwards improvement.

There has been a variety of maintenance work carried out over the past year:

- Grant funding from Cllr Yonne Peacock and Newcastle Building Society enabled us to repair the damaged wall in the Youth Club room and to replace the upstairs carpet.
- The car park gates were removed, blasted, repainted and are now back in situ.
- Current building maintenance projects include replacing side windows and making sure the roof is properly insulated to keep the building warm and reduce our carbon footprint. Some of the fire doors are being replaced and the office has received a muchneeded uplift.

Commercial use of the hall continues to thrive in the way of Craft Fairs, Tabletop Sales and the Tuesday Market. The Saturday Markets that were piloted in 2023 were a great success and will continue in 2024. Annual bookings such as the Spine Race and Gems Fair also continue.

importance of remembrance. Sometimes people think young people are not interested or don't understand why we have Remembrance Day, but that is not true. Being part of CCF at school has helped me and the link with the RBL is a great way for the different generations to work together." The Wensleydale School's headteacher Julia Polley, who started her career in the RAF, added: "This partnership is significant. We hope students, parents and even many within the community will see the important role the RBL has in our community by considering membership, which will help to secure the RBL's future."

The joint parade was the second event since the partnership was formed and follows the school's annual CCF presentation in the summer, where Chairman David Halliday officially welcomed the cadets to the branch. David said: "Leyburn and District branch of the Royal British Legion are proud of their affiliation with Wensleydale School CCF and equally proud to have them stand with us on this annual Act of Remembrance in Leyburn. "We would also like to think that some of the cadets could be tomorrow's British Legion members". The parade highlighted the intergenerational role of the RBL, with young and old coming together to commemorate its longevity. It comes at a time when the charity finds its existence under threat due to a drop in membership, because elderly members are not replaced by younger members. If numbers drop any further the Leyburn branch is at risk of becoming a sub branch. We are now looking forward to a programme of events running up to Christmas and hope that you will join us for some of these.




